



As Avondale commemorates its Diamond Anniversary Year, the city also celebrates the landmarks that have contributed to the success of the city. Phoenix Raceway (PIR) - originally Phoenix International Raceway – is one such important landmark.

Built in 1964 against the backdrop of the beautiful Estrella Mountains, the original road course was 2 miles long and ran both inside and outside of the main oval track. It was built with the goal of being the western home of open wheel racing, replacing the old racing track at the Arizona State Fairgrounds.

NASCAR didn't come onto the scene till 1977 at the track, and in 1988, NASCAR's premier series began racing at PIR, with the first race won by Alan Kulwicki.

The City recently updated its plan for the area formerly known as the Avondale City Center. Rebranded as The BLVD and located on Avondale Boulevard just off the I-10, this area will be the next destination "hot spot" in the West Valley for shopping, dining, entertainment, living, and employment; a true live/work/ play concept. With more than 350 acres for future development, The BLVD will encompass five trendy, pedestrian-friendly district concepts that will be the heart of Avondale.

SPORTS ON THE BLVD

Located on The BLVD is the Randall McDaniel Sports Complex, home to American Sports Centers-Avondale. The largest indoor multi-sport facility in Arizona, ASC Avondale features 6 volleyball courts, 4 basketball courts, 2 indoor soccer fields, and a 4,000 square foot multi-purpose room. ASC hosts a wide variety of leagues, classes, and clinics for athletes of all ages. On the weekends, you'll see a combination of regional tournaments, leagues, and special events throughout the year.



WHAT'S ON THE BLVD

Stay tuned for all kinds of exciting development poised to arrive at the BLVD.

Avondale celebrates its semisesquicentennial year (say that fast five times!) in 2021.

In other words, it's the city's 75th year or Diamond Anniversary!

So much has changed since Avondale's founding father, William "Billy" G. Moore, arrived in Arizona in the late 1860s, settling near the Agua Fria River in 1880, and calling it "Coldwater, Arizona," after the river that flowed through. Back then, Coldwater was just a general store and stage stop near the Agua Fria River crossing. The city took its name from "Avondale Ranch," where the post office was established in 1896. The main street, which we know today as Western Avenue in the heart of "Old Town"– spurred the area's growth, leading to the incorporation of Avondale in 1946.

OLD TOWN CHARM

As the area of "Old Town" grew, development consisted of a conglomeration of styles and architecture along Western Avenue typical of small western towns, with ranching, the railroad and cotton farming as main industries. The area has an eclectic look, yet also preserves the historic business district and safeguards opportunities for small, independent businesses to thrive today. Avondale is proud that the roots of our city are still strong in the area; many of the residential streets bear the names of the families that first established here, such as Aragon, Hill and Madden. Western Avenue is a pedestrian-friendly zone featuring locally-owned small businesses, unique and award winning restaurants, cultural and urban art, and eclectic building-scapes that run the stretch from Central Avenue to Dysart Road. Government buildings such as the modern Sam Garcia Western Avenue Library, a fire station, police substation, parks and plazas are a hub for an area that boasts so much charm today. Over the years, the City has partnered with business owners to give several historic buildings a facelift with new facade improvements, while staying true to the street's uniquely Avondale character.





ROOTS

During the early part of Arizona's statehood, vast acres of farm fields sprung to life in this part of the valley. During World War I, the demand for cotton surged in the United States. This led to expansive use of land for cotton farming in the Southwest Valley, bringing thousands of migrant workers from Mexico to turn the arid desert into suitable crops to supply the demand from US federal government. Amid this early growth, a pandemic struck, resulting in lives lost from the 1918 Spanish Flu. A cemetary was established by Goodyear Farms to bury the farmworkers and their families who died from the flu. The historical Goodyear Farms Cemetery today is cared for by the City of Avondale, which is committed to preserving the history of the pioneers who transformed the desert area into agricultural fields. Each year, the city teams up with Ballet Folklorico Esperanza to host a Dia de Los Muertos celebration to honor those who are buried at the cemetery.

HISTORY – THE "HEART" OF ARIZONA

The United States was acquired from Mexico in 1854. The historical reference of Gadsden Purchase included lands south of the Gila River and west of the Rio Grande where the US federal government wanted to build a transcontinental railroad along a deep southern route. The US government, in order to establish Arizona territory, marked the land accordingly from a high point just south of the Gila River, known today as Monument Hill. This point was not only the northern boundary of Mexico, but eventually became the starting point for surveys when Arizona was established as a state. Numerous round USGS markers, and an artistic "X" top this hill, mark the spot of this site, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. Monument Hill is adjacent to Phoenix Raceway, and the Base & Meridian Wildlife area, in the southern part of the city. There are awesome views of the confluence of the Salt and Gila Rivers, Estrella Mountains and downtown Phoenix from atop the official midpoint of the entire state.



LOWER GILA RIVER COLLABORATIVE

Did you know City of Avondale is part of the Lower Gila River Collaborative (LGRC), a growing cooperative effort to restore natural resources along the lower Gila River, which will improve access to nature-based recreation, and promote the river as an amenity in the West Valley?

The lower Gila River stretches from West Phoenix, east to the historic Gillespie Dam Bridge, providing opportunities for bird watching, fishing, kayaking, and more. Every year in February, Avondale hosts the Tres Rios Nature Festival at Base and Meridian Wildlife Area to celebrate this ecologically-rich desert waterway. LGRC is increasing these kinds of opportunities for communities to get to know their backyard river, while improving wildlife habitat and restoring river flows. Among the biggest challenges that the partners are taking on is invasive salt cedar, a Mediterranean tree species that drastically alters the flow and function of the river.

The LGRC invites the public to participate in restoration and stewardship. Explore opportunities by viewing the newly unveiled website on this initiative, **www.lowergilariver.net**. Learn more, get involved – visit the online event calendar, sign up for volunteer opportunities, and attend upcoming meetings.

When traveling Arizona's spectacular landscapes and unique destinations, or even when exploring closer to home -- preserve what is natural, and Leave No Trace.
